






With the help of an adult read from the Scriptures Marqaus (Mark) 3:13-21 and Luqa (Luke) 6:12-16

The story of how Yeshua called His 12 disciples is found in all four gospels. Some names change from one book to another, other names are replaced by new ones. Also, some of them were earthly brothers to each other. The professions of some of them before they left everything and followed their Master Yeshua are also mentioned.

Before introducing you to the 12 disciples, answer what Yeshua did before choosing them and why we should do the same when making important decisions (Luke 6:12-13).



These are the 12 disciples Yeshua chose after praying all night to His Father Beit Sefer Yahweh. You can cut out this sheet and paste it somewhere visible to learn the names.



Kepha (Simon Peter), son of Jonah, fisherman.



Andrew, son of Jonah, fisherman.



Ya'akov (James), son of Zebedee, fisherman.



Yochanan (John), fisherman.



Matthew or Levi, son of Alphaeus, tax collector.



Ya'akov (James), son of Alphaeus.



Philip, from Bethsaida.



Bartholomew or Nathanael, son of Tolmai.



Thomas or Didymus (twin).



Shimon (Simon) the Zealot or Cananite.



Judas Thaddaeus.



Judas Iscariot.

Kepha (Simon Peter) and Andrew were two brothers that Yeshua called to be His disciples.

Kepha and Andrew were cutting wood when Yeshua found them, for they were carpenters.

When Ya'akov and Yochanan saw Yeshua, they followed him the next day after much thought.

Then Yeshua found Philip who was from Bethsaida, the city of Kepha and Andrew.

Philip told Nathanael (Bartholomew) that he had found someone who might be the Messiah, but he was not sure.

Yeshua told Nathanael that He had seen him under a palm tree, praying.

Yeshua saw Levi (Matthew) sitting at the public tribute bench and said to him: Follow Me.

Yeshua dining in Levi's house was criticized for eating with tax collectors and sinners.

Yeshua answered the scribes and Pharisees: I have not come to call sinners, but only the righteous.






















Follow the lines and help Yeshua reach each pair of disciples.





It is thought that the miracle of turning water into wine at the wedding at Cana was Yeshua's first miracle. In Yochanan (John) 2:1-12 we see that this served for Yeshua to manifest His glory and His disciples to believe in Him.

Join with a line the order of the events that took place in the wedding.

1. Yeshua was invited to the wedding together with His disciples.

2. Miriam comments to Yeshua that the wine is finished and He replies that His hour has not yet come.

3. Yeshua orders 6 waterpots to be filled with water.

4. Yeshua asks that wine be brought to the master of the feast.

5. The master of the feast tastes it and tells the bridegroom that he has left the good wine until that moment.

6. The disciples saw His glory manifested and believed in Him.

7. After this, Yeshua with His mother, brothers and disciples went down to Capernaum.



















