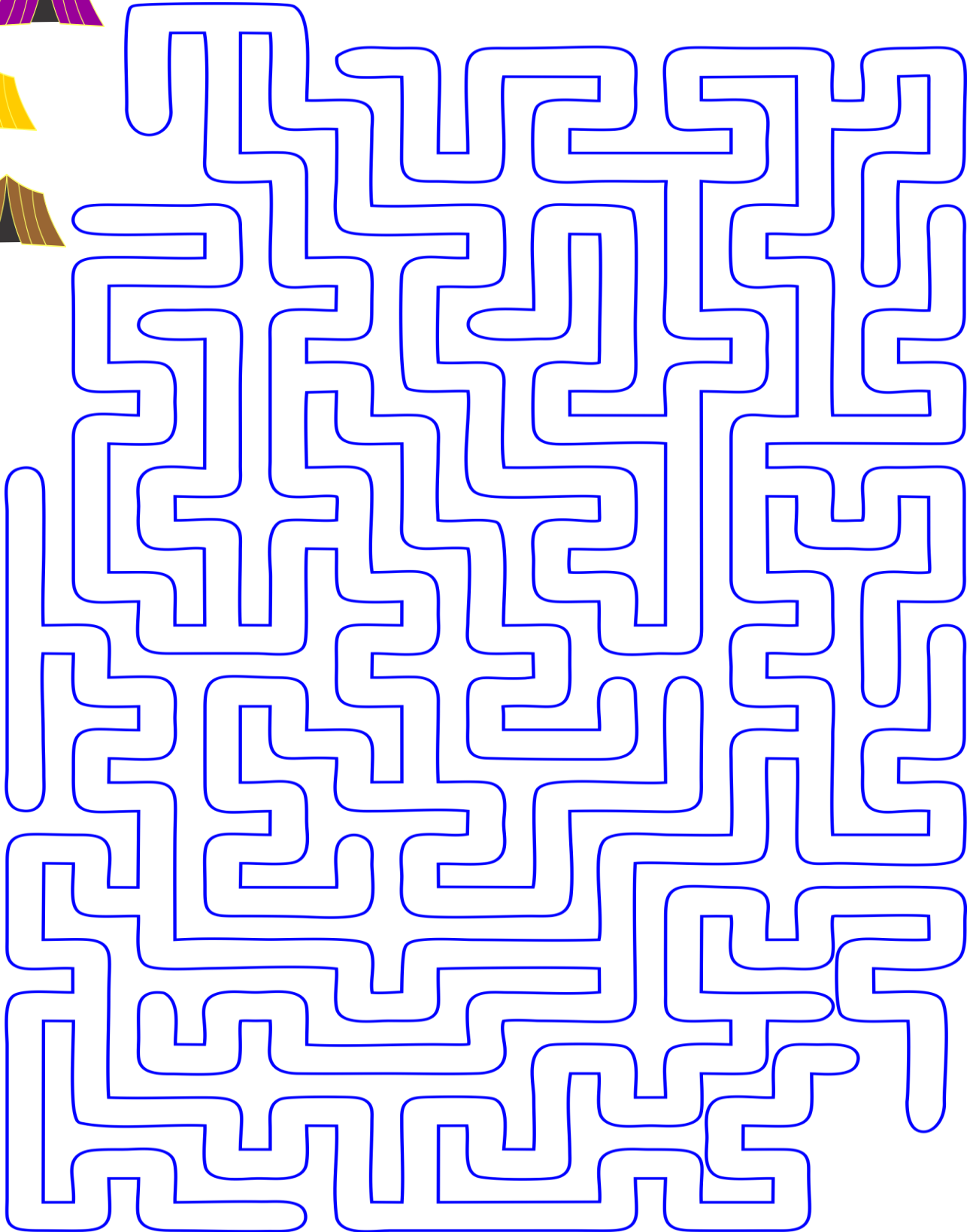
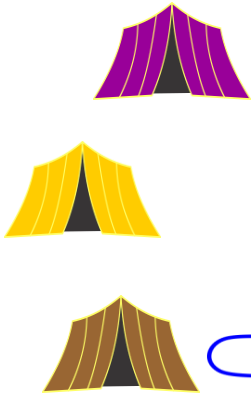
Moses must get to the tents of the men who revealed themselves.
Help Moses find the way, trace the dotted lines.





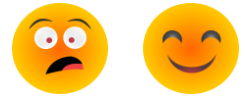
Moses told the congregation to depart from the tents of those ungodly men lest they perish along with them.
