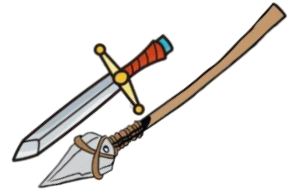

in their place.*





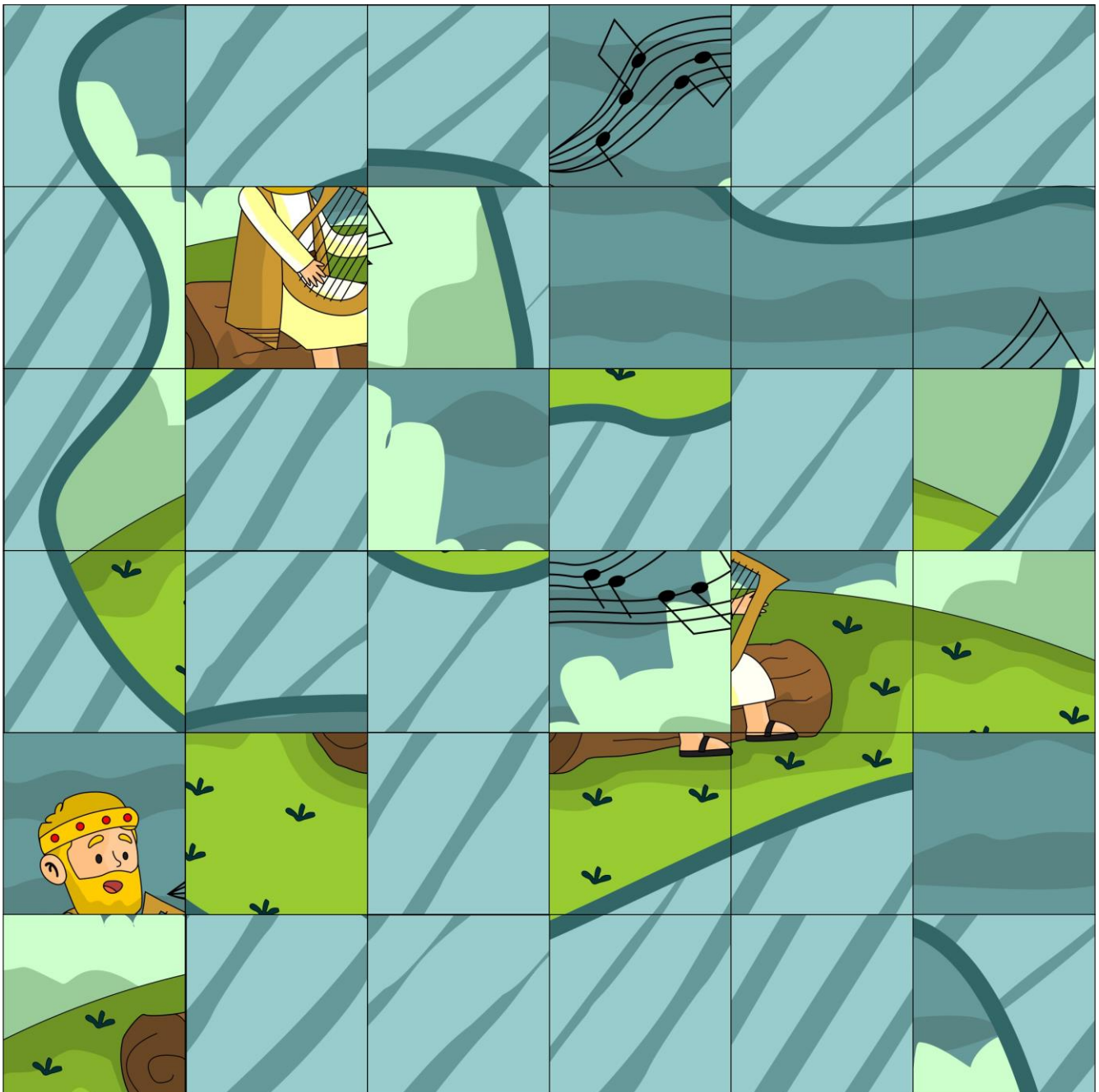
