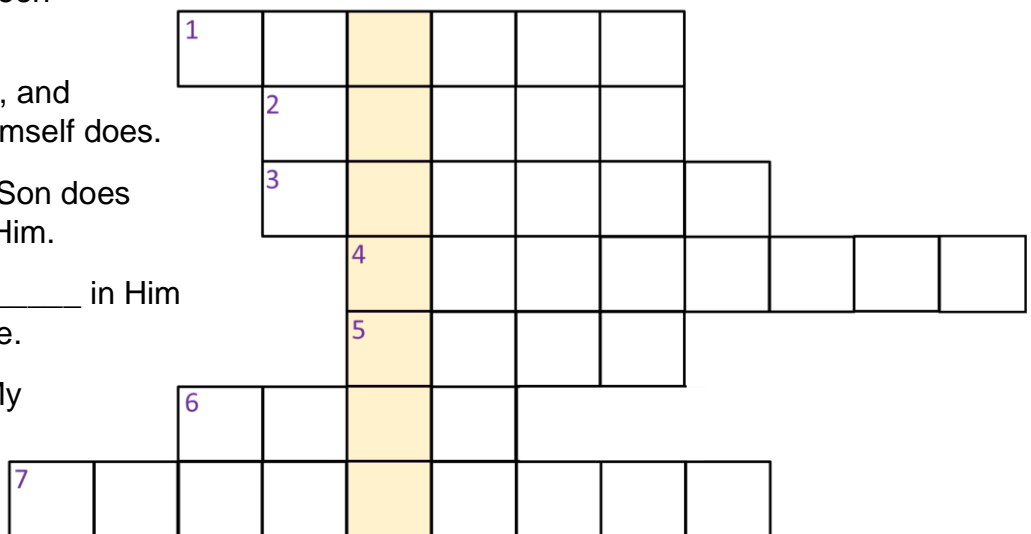

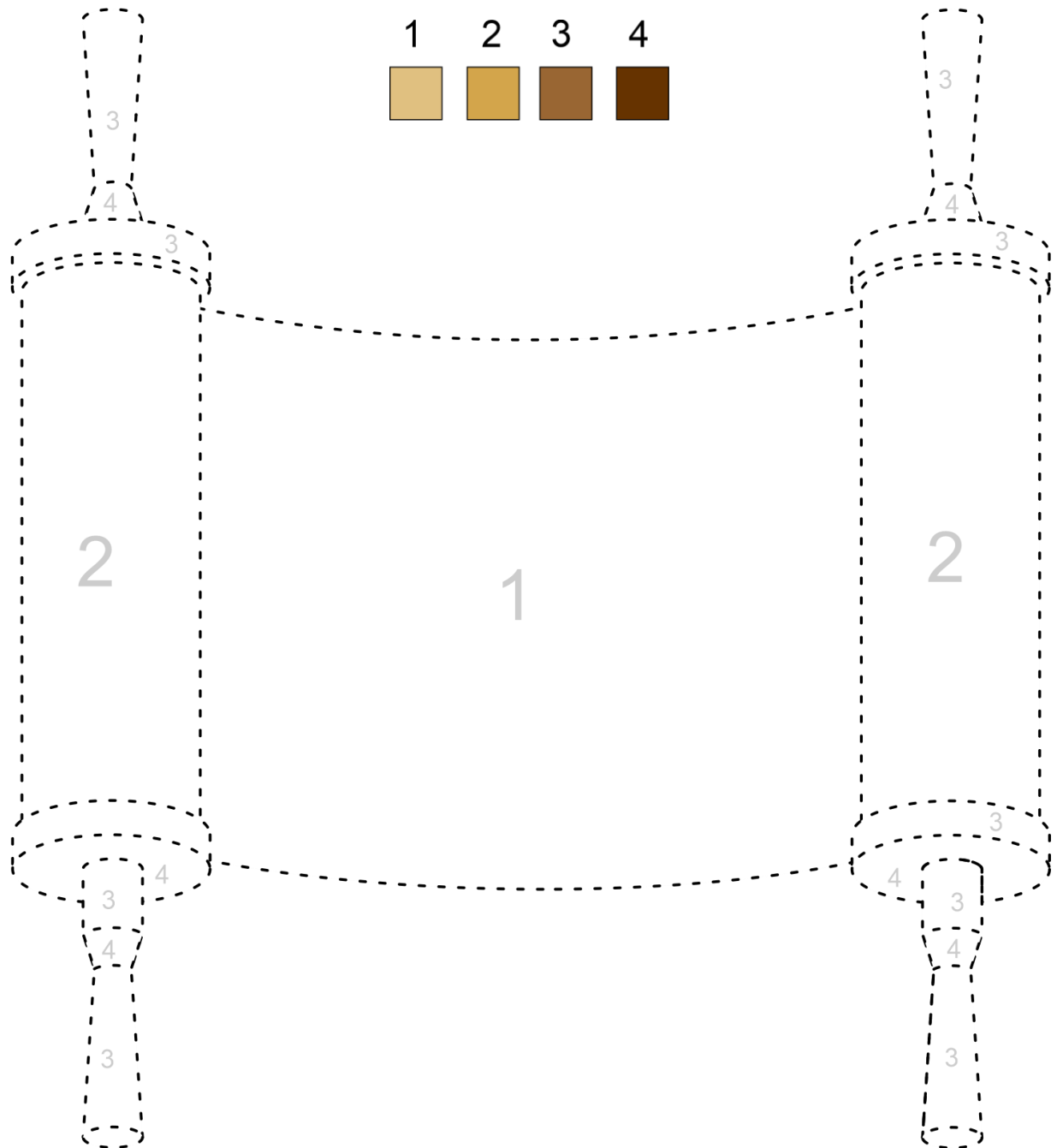

Follow the dots and discover the hidden figure, then color.

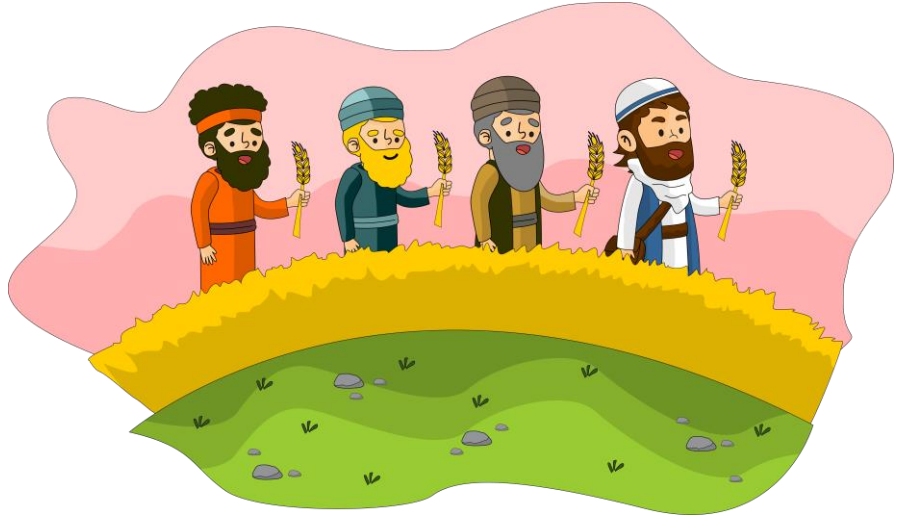

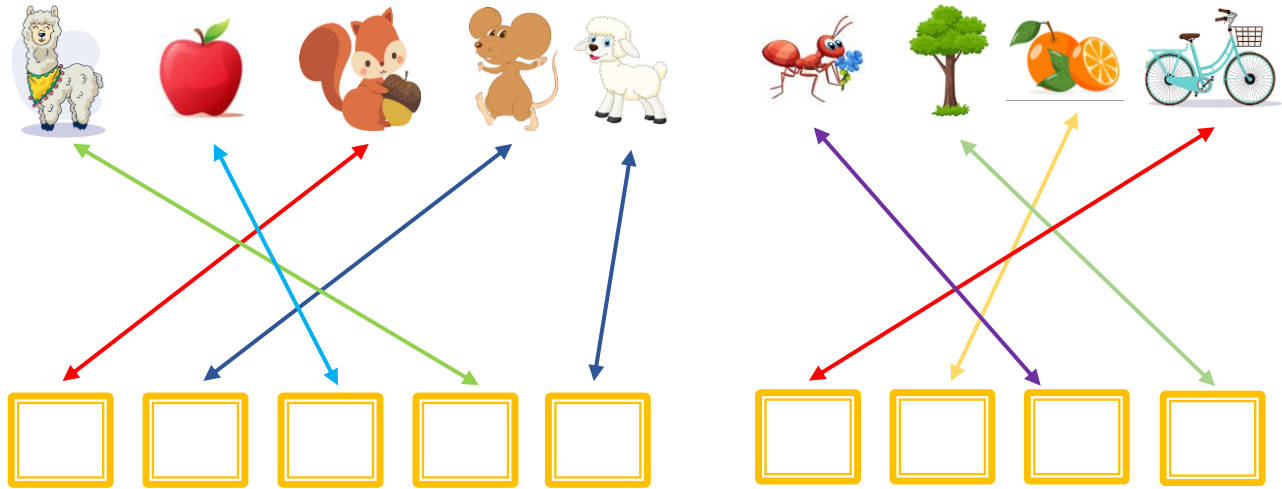

Put the initial letter of each figure in the corresponding box and you will find out which is the object:

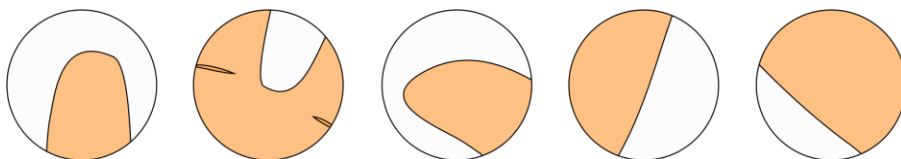

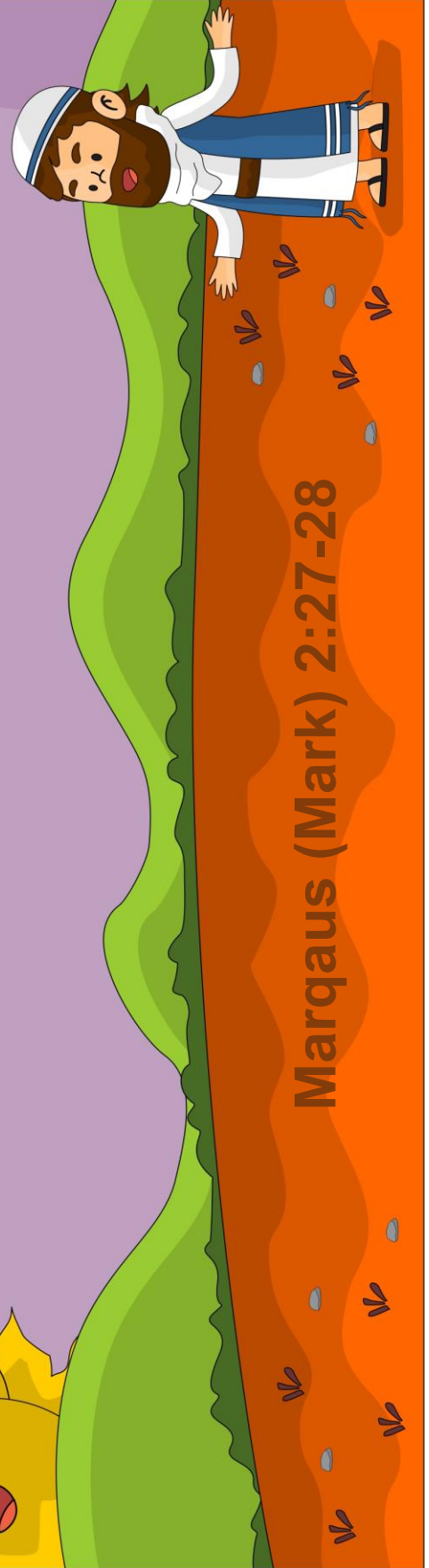


With the help of an adult, cut out and glue the pieces of paper on the hand to relieve its dryness.
