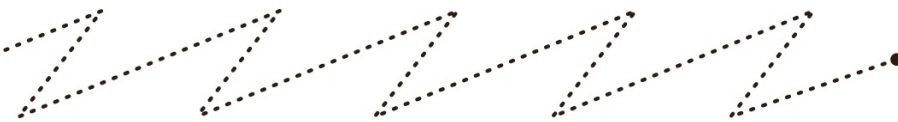

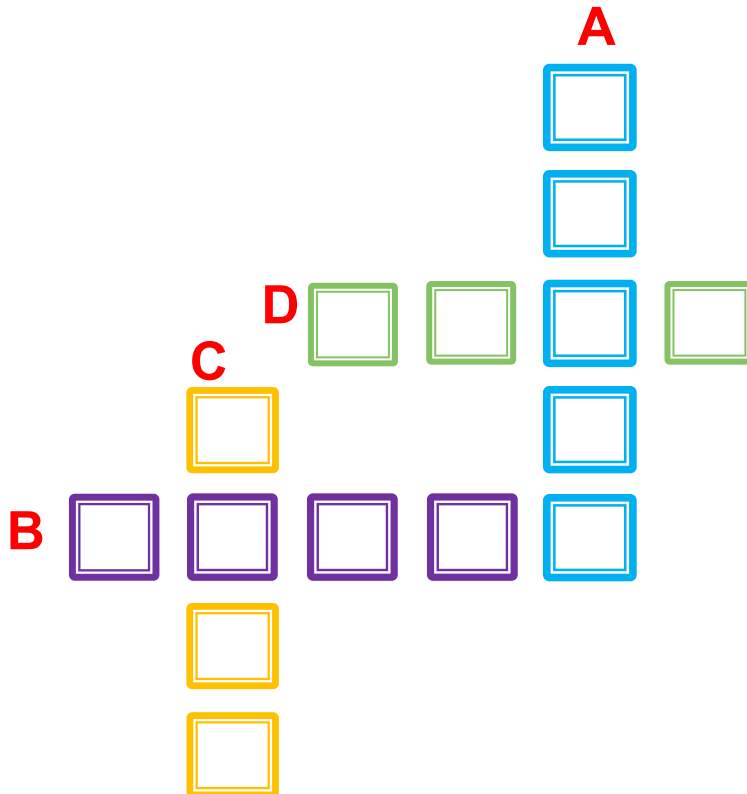

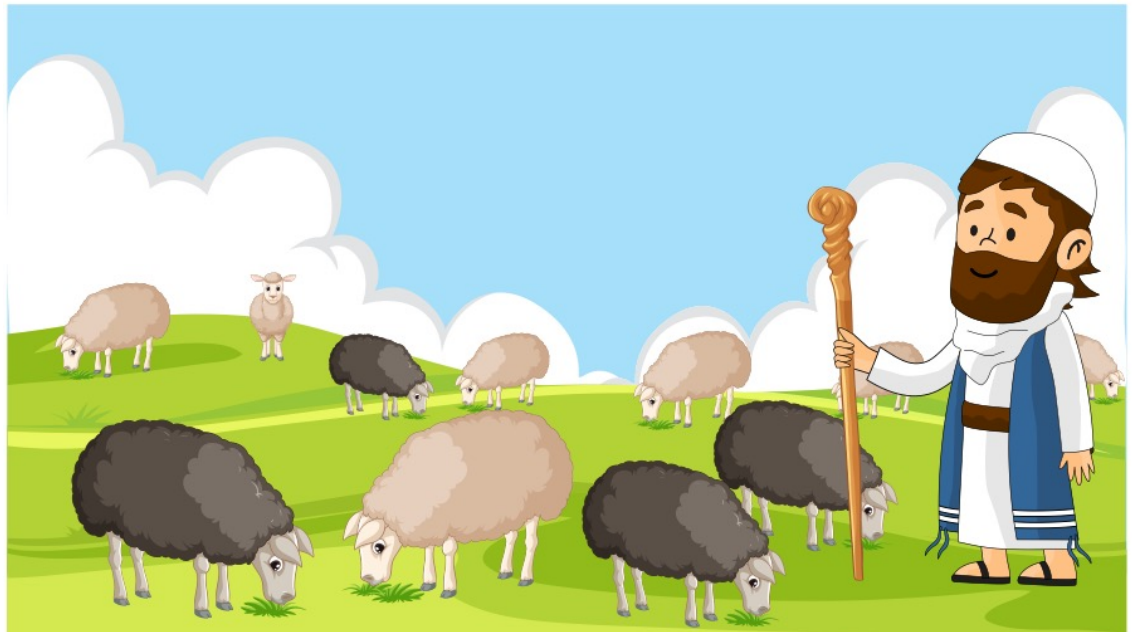
The Parable of the Good Shepherd

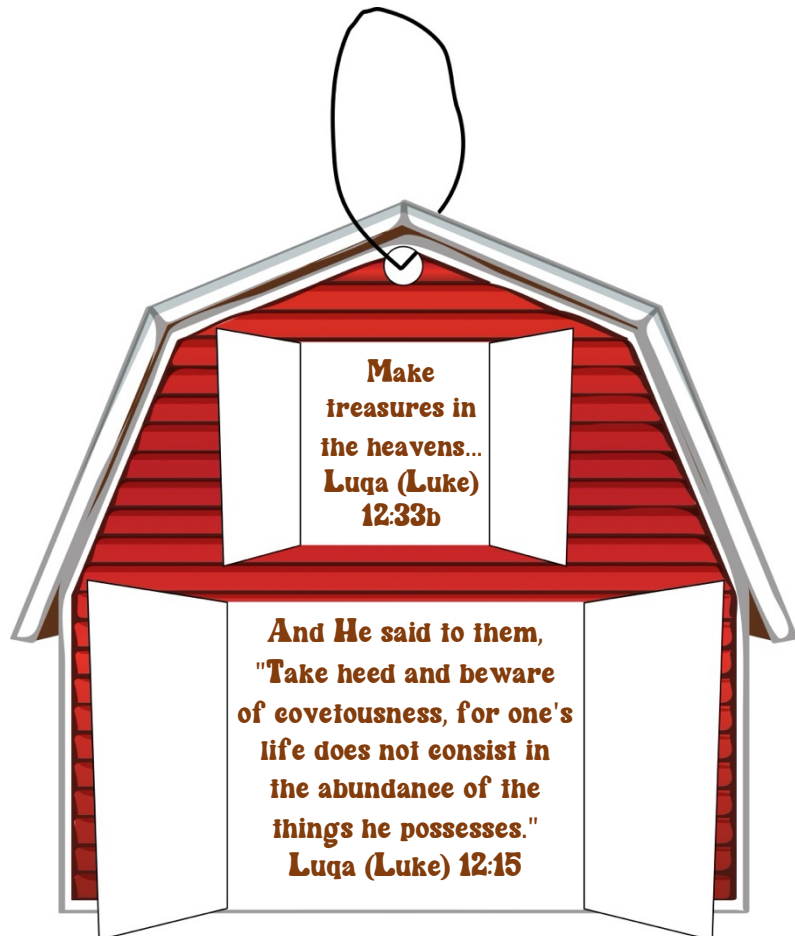

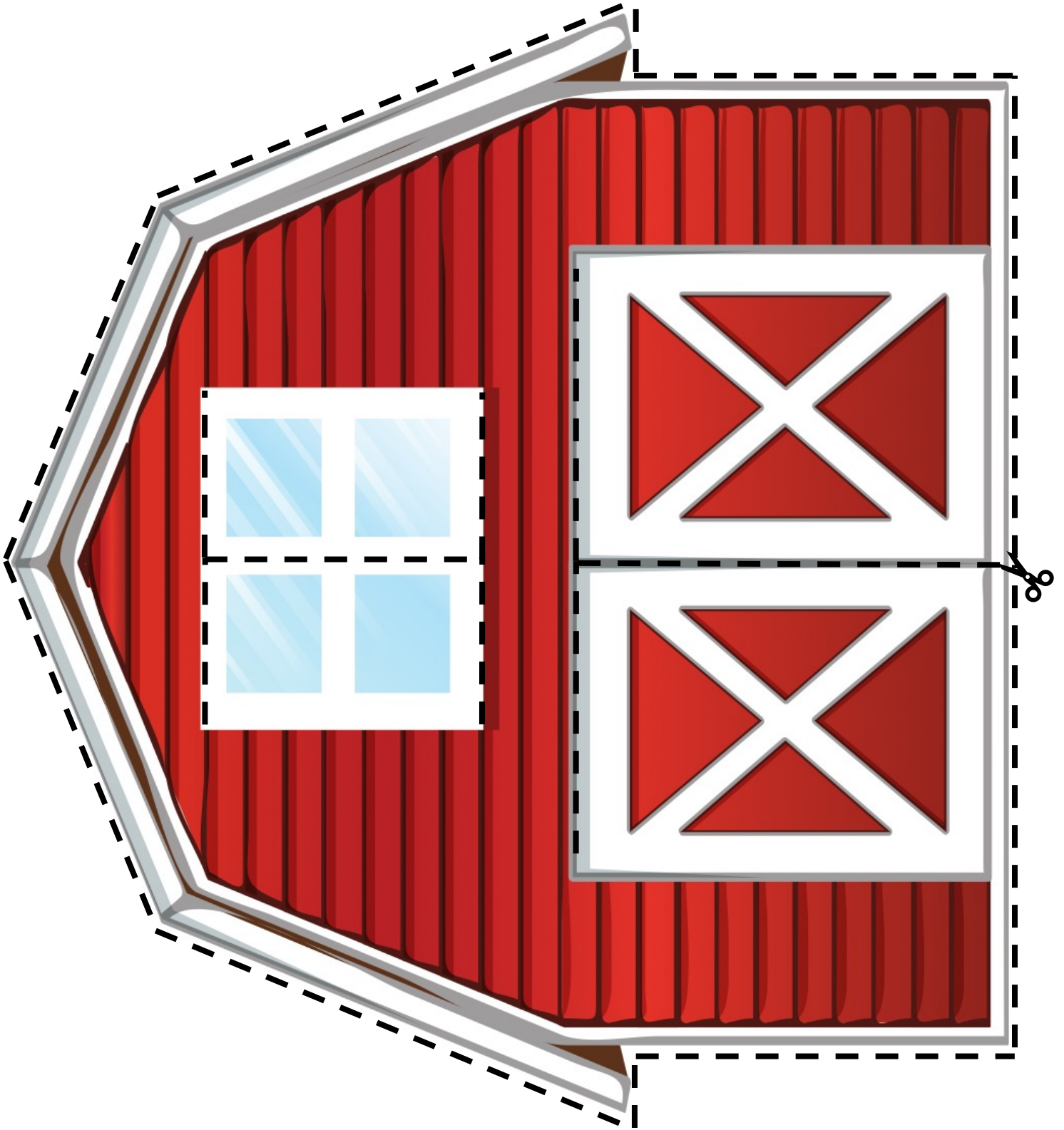
