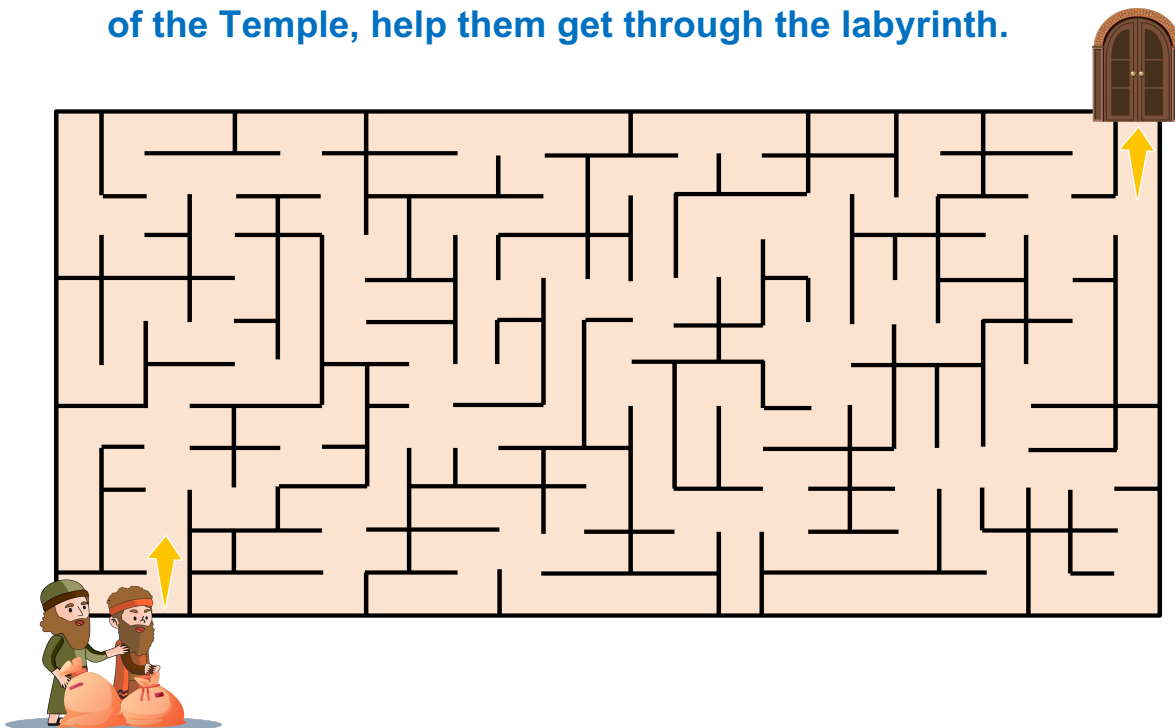

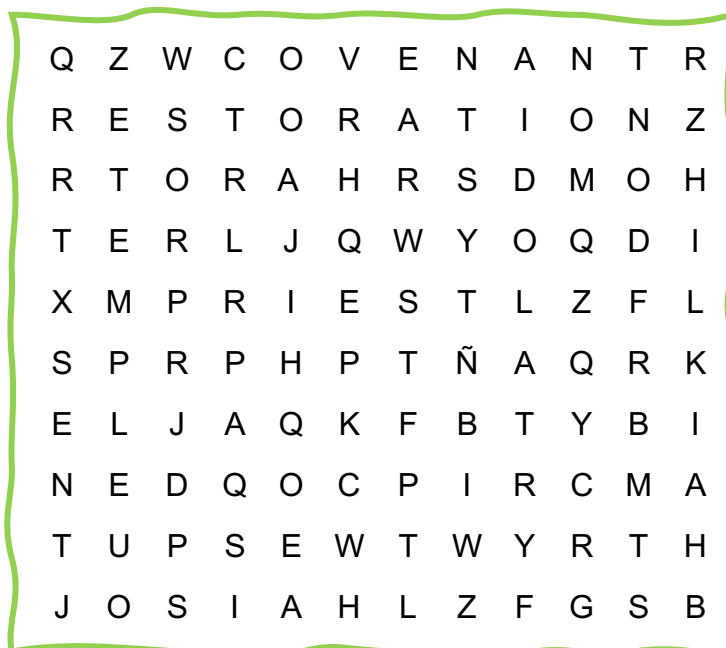

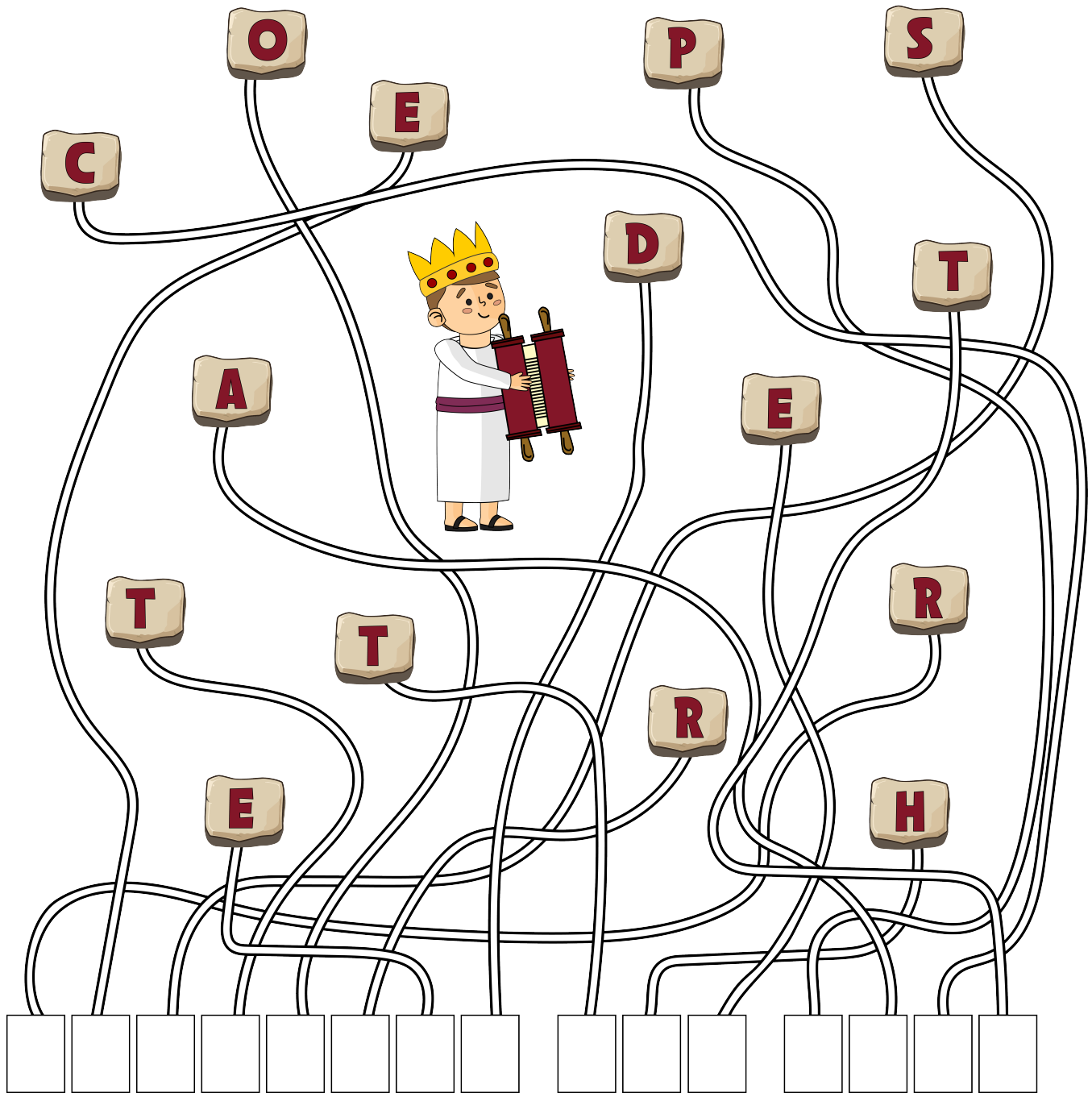

With the help of an adult, follow the instructions and create a Torah scroll and keep it where you sleep so that you will see it when you get up and go to bed and remember to keep Yahweh's commandments.

Answer: What other changes would you also have made as a king?

Step 1: Get carton, cardboard or toilet paper rolls (10 cm high is suggested) and two wooden sticks to create 2 cylinders.



Step 2: Before closing the cylinders, put a wooden stick or wooden rods inside the cylinders and glue it with glue.



Step 3: On a piece of colored or patterned paper (suggested 10 cm high by 30 cm wide) glue the cutout on the next page, leaving a border to glue to our cylinders.



Step 4: Finally, roll it all up and close it with a thread or wool. In this way you will create a Torah scroll.
